- A. NBWC Item 8*First Reading – NBWC Policies FOR POSSIBLE ACTION
 - a. NBWC 8A Policy 1 – General Guidelines for the NBWC. The NBWC will have a first reading of NBWC Policy 1 and may take action to revise the policy and move to a second reading.
 - b. NBWC 8B. Policy 4 – Petition Process and Adoption of Regulations – The NBWC will have a first reading of NBWC Policy 4 and may take action to revise the policy and move to a second reading.

The NBWC may take action to provide recommendations or modifications of the second draft.

Petition – FOR POSSIBLE ACTION The petition requests the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners consider the removal of freshwater stingrays (Potamotrygon spp.) from Nevada’s Prohibited Aquatic Species List or reclassification of the species to a regulated/controlled species category.

- E. NBWC 13*. Appeal – Mr. Daniel King -Deputy Attorney General Richard Yien as Department counsel Mr. King is appealing the denial of his sub-guide license.

H. 22. Commission Regulations – Public Comment Allowed FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

A* NBWC Commission Regulation 26-10, Migratory Game Bird Seasons, Bag Limits, and Special Regulations for Waterfowl and Webless Migratory Game Birds; Public Hunting Limited on Wildlife Management Areas and Designated State Lands – 2026-2027 Season – The Commission will consider recommendations for seasons, bag limits, and special regulations for migratory game birds for the 2026-2027 season and adopt regulations consistent with the proposed regulation framework for the 2026-2027 hunting seasons on certain migratory game birds established by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. The Commission will also consider rules regulating public hunting on Wildlife Management Areas and designated state lands.

I. NBWC 23. Commission General Regulations – Workshop/Public FOR POSSIBLE ACTION

- a. A*. Commission General Regulation 516 – Boating Equipment and Operation Revisions The Commission will hold a workshop to consider regulation language amending Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) that is mandated by the United States Coast Guard on the requirements of fire extinguishers and clean up language for operating at a flat wake.
- b. B*. Commission General Regulation 517 – Automatic Range Finding Scopes – The Commission will hold a workshop to consider regulation language amending Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) that would prohibit the use of range finding scopes that automatically adjusts the sight reticle or aiming point while hunting certain species with a firearm, bow, or crossbow.
- c. C*. Commission General Regulation 526 – Thermal Imaging Equipment – The Commission will hold a workshop to consider regulation language amending Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) that would amend dates and set location or possession restrictions when the use of thermal imaging equipment is unlawful.
- d. D*. Commission General Regulation 529 – Disability Permit Program Revisions –The Commission will hold a workshop to consider regulation language amending Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) that would update business rules and requirements related to the archery, visual and special assistance disability permits.
- e. E*. Commission General Regulation 530 – Master Guides – The Commission will hold a workshop to consider regulation language amending Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) that creates consistent guidelines for the Department to follow to deny, revoke or suspend a guides license for specified convictions, unethical conduct, or regulatory violations, and to establish clear penalty tiers based on offense type and demerit values.
- f. F*. Commission General Regulation 531 – Shed Antler Revisions – The Commission will hold a workshop to consider regulation language amending Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) that creates different seasons for shed antler collection, adding certain private lands and definitions.
