Comm. Jacobson moved to approve the agenda with the requested amendments

Comm. Gray seconded and the motion passed 5-0.

6. Time Certain

6.a. Time Certain at 10:00 A.M. Public Hearing- Bill No. 22-02: For Possible Action: Approve an ordinance amending Lyon County Code Title 1 - Administrative, Chapter 5 - Board of County Commissioners, by amending Section 3 Election District Boundaries.

6.b. Time Certain at 10:15 AM: Presentation only on Bail Jail reform by Sheriff's Office.

Sheriff Frank Hunewill, Lieutenant Barnes and Nicole Cisneros, from the Lyon County Sheriff's Office, gave a presentation summarizing the requirements of Bill 424; the current process in booking/releasing and the anticipated effects on process for the Jail, District and Municipal Courts, as well as the District Attorney's office.

Discussion continued between the Commissioners and Sheriff Hunewill regarding process, policy and potential staffing/funding demands.

8. Commissioners/County Manager reports

Comm. Jacobson congratulated Wendy Madson on the Nevada Human Services award. He attended the Youth Stepping Up Forum, and thanked Eric Smith and Shayla Holmes for hosting it. He also attended the Lyon County Emergency Planning meeting. Several Dayton residents have contacted him regarding the flooding issues in that area which was touched on at that meeting. Comm. Jacobson asked County Manager Jeff Page to speak about the floodplains on both sides of Highway 50. He attended the Fernley City Council meeting via Zoom. Comm. Jacobson recognized Sheriff Hunewill for his hard work throughout the County. He went on to say the City of Fernley is expressing a lot of growth concerns and they lost the first round of their lawsuit regarding the lining of the canal. He expressed the need to support the City of Fernley in the fight against lining the canal. He ended by thanking Dayton High school for the Polo shirt they gave him.

Comm. Gray asked if Comm. Jacobson knew why the City of Fernley lost the first round against lining the canal. Comm. Jacobson responded there were various reasons. TCID and BORD didn't have to conduct any studies showing any possible damages lining the canal may cause. Basically saying it is for
