1. Roll Call

6.a. TIME CERTAIN at 9:30 A.M: For Presentation Only: Presentation on possible future Mounted Patrol Unit for the Lyon County Sheriff's Office. Introduction to the program and how it will work and be set up.

Sheriff Frank Hunewill gave an overview of proposed program presented to him by his Deputies.

Deputy Lenihan gave a presentation on the Mounted Patrol Unit and how it can benefit the community, the history, the decline of, volunteer units, and training.

Comm. Gray asked how they plan to obtain funding, veterinarian bills, insurance and etcetera.

Deputy Lenihan stated they are owned by the deputies and are paid for by them.
