2. Invocation given by Matt Christiansen of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints

Matt Christiansen gave the invocation.

Joann Lawson gave a report of the mine meeting and concern of the Lands Bill.

Erin Lopez noted an error on the agenda item number 25 public participation be prior to the adjournment and reconvene as Lyon County Board of Commissioners.

Comm. Jacobson moved to approve the agenda as presented, Comm. Hockaday seconded, and the motion passed 5-0.

Comm. Gray expressed his condolences to the school shooting in TX. He requested a moment of silence.

Comm. Jacobson agreed with Commissioner Gray.

Comm. Henderson will attend the SLUPAC meeting tomorrow, he also agreed with Comm. Gray.

Comm. Hockaday thanked those who helped prepare Hillcrest Cemetery for Memorial Day all who attended the Veterans ceremony, gave a report of the bear situation in Smith Valley. He also attended the HudBay meeting and helped facilitate the meeting. He gave a current report of the Lands Bill.

Comm. Keller thanked Comm Hockaday for his comments. She also attended the Veterans Memorial in Fernley. She stated there was another fatality on Hwy 95A yesterday and the importance of the safety issues.

Comm. Gray attended the Veteran ceremony in Dayton and commented how well the grounds are kept. He stated Highway 50 and Highway 95A are both safety concerns and gave an account of his own experiences. Tony Yaroborough, a long time VFW member passed away unexpectedly.

County Manager Jeff Page reported there is a shortage of DEF, which is an additive in diesel fuel and how it will impact the counties new fleet vehicles. He also attended the Veterans Ceremony in Fernley and thanked the VFW. Staff is moving forward on the ARPA project. Citizens Advisory Boards are not elected because the Board of County Commissioners per NRS 244 appoints them. If a community wants the Board elected then they have to go through the process of becoming an unincorporated township. There was a report of a mining explosion in Smith Valley. Jeff Page stated that it was not the mine, there is nothing going on at the mine and it is believed that it was blowing up beaver dams and not the proposed HudBay mine. He stated that in July they would be scheduling meetings to collect input on the Lands Bill. The draft is not finalized at this time. He congratulated all the graduating seniors. He encouraged Safe and Sober night.
