Comm. Keller moved to approve the agenda as presented. Comm. Henderson seconded and the motion passed 8-0.

Clerk Treasurer Nikki Bryan reported the City of Fernley has joined the meeting as a joint meeting to canvass their election along with Lyon County. She reviewed the contents and process of the backup with the Board and believed its contents to be accurate.

Comm. Hockaday asked for clarification on the time casts percentages with the actual number. Nikki Bryan reviewed the voting process. Some voters may elect not to cast a vote for some candidates on the ballot and the numbers would reflect how many voted to how many voted for that section.

Comm. Keller moved to canvass the vote from the 2022 Primary Election, per NRS 293.387.

Public Participation

Dana Uhlhorn gave his concern of the procedures at the DMV and the effects of the voters who are registered as an independent and not being eligible to vote in the Primary Election.

She also reviewed the opportunities the voters have to change their registration up to Election Day and would have been able to vote.
