

Stagecoach Advisory Board

Wednesday, August 3, 2022 at 7:00 PM

1. Call to Order

Chair Charles Shirley called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM and read the Agenda header information.

2. Roll Call; Determination of a Quorum

Charles (Charlie) Shirley, Annette Carpenter, Amanda (Mandy) Brinnand present – quorum met.
Angela DeFord and Cassandra Aveiro – excused absence.

3. Pledge of Allegiance

Vanessa (Stuart) was asked to lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. Public Participation

There was none given.

5. For Possible Action: Review and adoption of agenda

Mandy moved to approve the agenda as presented, Annette seconded and the motion passed, 3-0.

6. Chair & Board Member Comments

Annette – None

Mandy – There is a Waste Management Workshop on August 18 in Dayton, the agenda will be available on Lyon County website. BOCC approved the Dayton Valley storm drainage plans and are also building a second bridge over the Carson River in Dayton. Hoping the Stagecoach area will be looked at for storm drainage plans soon. The Sierra Range Consultants zoning change was approved by the Board of County Commissioners, they have now applied for a conditional use permit for the shooting range, which is located about 2 miles east of Stagecoach; the zoning change will go before the planning commission at the September 13 planning meeting. A presentation on the zoning change had already been requested for the August meeting and Andrew Haskin from Lyon County would be at that meeting.
Charlie – Thanked everyone for coming and welcomed them.

7. For Possible Action: Approval of minutes from the July 6, 2022 meeting

Charlie, Annette, Angela and Cassandra were in attendance at the July 6, 2022 meeting, Mandy had an excused absence so wasn't present. Charlie and Annette are the only two present at today's meeting, so a quorum to approve these minutes isn't present, will be tabled to the September 7, 2022 meeting.

8. For Possible Action: To forward a recommendation on monthly training needs and availability to the County Manager's office.

Lyon County has asked if we would like to set up a monthly meeting to ask questions we may have and what days we would be available. The board discussed this item and if this was mandatory training and if there were other training available as well. This item is for monthly meetings for continued training and for the board members to ask questions of the County and get answers, not associated with the required advisory board yearly trainings, it is also voluntary.

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Mandy made a motion to accept the voluntary monthly meetings and have Erin enquire about the availability of board members for a date of the meeting. Annette seconded and the motion passed 3-0.

9. Community Reports

- A. Lyon County Commissioner/Manager Office – none present
- B. Silver Springs/Stagecoach Hospital Board of Trustees – Vanessa Stuart. The monthly meeting is 3rd Thursday of this month, 6 pm at district. Working on a conditional use permit for a modular office for rural Nevada counseling.
- C. Public Safety: Sheriff Department/NHP – none present
- D. Animal Services – Vanessa Stuart. There is a vaccination clinic August 27, 11-4 at the shelter. These clinics have been extremely successful over the last three years. Cost is \$15/shot for vaccinations for dogs and cats, which is very inexpensive, but they don't offer rattlesnake or off-the-wall vaccinations. During the shelter FY23 budget session, the shelter requested a surgery suite so they can do spay and neuters at the shelter. They will receive \$35,000; a non-profit, Friends of Lyon County, also raised money. They are currently ordering equipment and hoping to spay/neuter at the shelter by the end of this year.
- E. Central Lyon County Fire and Rescue – Brad Bolton. They used to rely on volunteers, but now need permanent employees. Average calls are 4,200 per year - Silver Springs has 1,373 and Stagecoach has 458. They need personnel to staff the Silver Springs station, they have the equipment and stations, just not personnel. Funding for Central Lyon County Fire & Rescue personnel will be on November ballot. They want to be at the Advisory Board meetings and let people know about the services they offer, trailer drop, (funded by NV Energy through our power bills).

Mandy asked if on the November ballot if the funding was for the Silver Springs or Stagecoach station and if it was for funding permanent personnel - what will be on the ballot? Brad said it would be a voter approved budget increase, would be requesting a 23 cent tax increase, not sure, but thinks it would increase assessed valuation by about \$6 per month; it would go to personnel only. He also stated he doesn't have all the numbers though and this was an estimate.

Charlie asked if it was for all of Central Lyon County Fire; Brad said yes it was.

Public Comment

Rebecca Martinez – Asked if it was a special assessment on top of the taxes or part of the rate or how would it work? Brad said he wasn't sure, but it would be based on your assessed value. Rebecca asked if it was forever and if it would go up. Brad said it would be forever and it wouldn't go up unless voted on. Brad also clarified he wasn't the person to rely on the numbers for.

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Steve Litsinger – Asked about using Stagecoach personnel to staff the Silver Springs station. Brad said it wouldn't solve the issue, it would strip Stagecoach. Steve said the fire house is a great facility and he appreciates what they do.

F. Central Lyon County Parks and Recreation – none present

10. Correspondence

Charlie received a phone call but hasn't received the follow-up information he had asked for so will briefly mention details. Two or three teenagers are tearing up the park with quads, a water department employee called sheriff's department, but the police let kids go and didn't get names. The teenagers are now harassing the SGID employees. If anybody living around the park sees obnoxious kids, call the police.

Teri ~~Gahr~~ Hurt from SGID said she was the person that called sheriff department. They responded quickly but didn't do much. The kids were damaging the park, tearing up the park and were leaning the table up against the gazebo and were about to start climbing up and then noticed her filming and stopped, that's when the Sheriff showed up. The kids are now flipping SGID employees off and yelling at them every time they drive by. They will still keep calling, if a water foundation is put in, they tear it up, if a sani-hut is put in, they light toilet paper on fire. They are slightly concerned they may vandalize the SGID building. Charlie asked if the police officer took their names and Teri said she doubted it, he spent about 30 seconds with them. He told Teri he told them to get their quads out of the park, get on the other side of the fence in the parking area and if he saw them in the park again he would impound them because they didn't have the stickers. As soon as the sheriff left, they started calling them (SGID) names. The park used to be really nice, but they have trashed it.

Charlie asked Teri if she can text him the name of the deputy, she said she would.
