2. Invocation given by Betty Weiser of the United Methodist

Pastor Nathan Sam-Whistler gave the invocation in place of Betty Weiser.

5. For Possible Action: Review and adoption of agenda

County Manager Jeff Page requested for items 6.c and 13.a to be removed from the agenda.

Comm. Jacobson moved to approve the agenda minus pulling items 6.c and 13.a, Comm. Hockaday seconded, and the motion passed 5-0.

6. Time Certain

6.a. Time Certain at 9:30 AM. For Presentation Only: A presentation from Hiren Bhavsar, the new Extension Educator for University of Nevada Reno, Lyon County Extension office in Yerington, to introduce staffing and programs.

Hiren Bhavsar introduced staffing and the University of Nevada Reno programs. He asked the Board to reach out to them if they know of needs for the community.

Hillary Dashiell gave an overview of the 4H programs for the children and the locations.

The Commissioners are in support of the programs they provide for the youth.

Comm. Hockaday recommended for them to attend an upcoming event in Smith Valley.

6.b. Time Certain 10.00 AM: For Report Only: Presentations given by Lyon County Community Development, Human Services, County Manager, and outside entities for possible grant submittals to Community Development Block Grant for FY23-24.

Grant Administrator Erin Lopez introduced the presenters. She gave an update, in October the applications will be submitted for eligibility to the State, and those that have pre-approval will come back to the Commission for approval at the first meeting November.

Shayla Holmes gave a presentation for housing needs in the community and the Housing Needs Assessment Plan. The local data will provide the needs assessment for future legislation.

Shayla Holmes gave a presentation for the proposed application for Targeted Neighborhood Cleanup. The proposal is to provide funding to clean up in certain areas of the communities to provide a safer environment and reduce code enforcement complaints.

Comm. Hockaday requested the scope to be for those who are not able to clean their properties. Andrew Haskin confirmed they are focusing on large-scale areas that could take years to clean.

Jeff Page gave a presentation of the potential to remodel the fire station for the Mound House Community Center. With ARPA funding it was approved to start the new build of the center. He gave the challenges with new build and lack of funding to fulfill the need. The remodel would provide more community assets and a sooner meeting place for the Mound House Advisory Board.
