8. Commissioners/County Manager reports

Comm. Henderson gave an update for the Dayton Regional Advisory Board, USDA and rural partner's network, and the CAMPO meetings. He commented Dayton Valley Days is the weekend.

Comm. Gray commented that the Freight Rails strike has been avoided. He requested if staff could address the abandoned RV at Rose Peek and Flowery, and possibly remove it.

Comm. Hockaday announced the event Fun Days in Smith Valley. On 10/8/2022 is the Haunted Dinner fundraiser at the Yerington Senior Center. He reported there was no camping in Wilson Canyon over the weekend and would like to see the area clear of long-term camping.

Comm. Jacobson attended the City of Fernley Council meeting. He recognized the passing of Veteran Richard Cook, and thanked the schools and organizations who held 9/11 ceremonies.

Comm. Keller appreciated those who participated in the 9/11 ceremonies. She commented at the Silver Springs Advisory Board, Jeff Page gave a report of the proposed Hospital, and Scott Keller gave his resignation at the meeting and will forward it to the BOCC.

County Manager Jeff Page reported today is the first day of Hispanic Heritage Month. Silver Springs Airport will have an open house in October. Senior Planner position is open as the employee is retiring in October. There will be more meetings for the proposed Hospital to identify needs by community and regions. The Community Development Department has created a form for developers to fill out and give to give to the Advisory Boards before their meetings. He addressed that ordinances have not previously gone to Advisory Boards for input. If it directed to change the process, it would increase the timeframe for them to be processed and moved forward.
